

# Migratory Shorebird Art Competition Terms & Conditions



**The promoter of this competition is the City of Canada Bay ABN: 79 130 029 35. By entering the competition, all entrants will be deemed to have accepted and agreed to be bound by the following terms and conditions:**

1. Competition entry:
  - a. Each entry must be an original artwork by a child residing in the City of Canada Bay between the ages of 5 and 14 years old.
  - b. Entrants must have the consent of a parent or guardian to enter the competition.
  - c. Parents and guardians must read and agree to the terms and conditions for entries to be considered.
  - d. If artworks are selected for publication, consent will be given to the City of Canada Bay to publish the first name and age of the entrant alongside the artwork.
  - e. If selected as a winner, the parent or guardian consents to the entrant and the parent or guardian to being photographed and participating in any related media event as part of the marketing campaign.
  - f. Children of employees of the City of Canada Bay and agencies associated with this promotion are ineligible to enter the competition, as are their immediate families.
  - g. All entries must be an independent creation by the entrant and free of any claims that they infringe any third party rights.
  - h. Entries must not have been published previously and/or have been used to win prizes in any other competitions.
  - i. To enter, entrants must sign up to Collaborate Canada Bay database ([collaborate.canadabay.nsw.gov.au](http://collaborate.canadabay.nsw.gov.au)) and submit an original photograph within the categories specified on the website. The Promoter reserves the right to verify the validity of entries.
  - j. The City of Canada Bay reserves the right to cancel or amend this competition or these terms and conditions without prior notice.
  
2. Entry requirements:
  - a. Your poster must be an A3 or A4 size in portrait orientation.
  - b. In 25 words or less, write your pledge onto the poster in clear letters.
  - c. Make key features of your poster as large as possible.
  - d. Try to keep your poster background light so that key features on your poster stand out and will be recognisable from a distance.
  - e. Each person can submit up to three entries.

- f. All artworks can be created with any medium including paints, crayons, pencils, markers and the like, or electronically via any illustration software like Adobe.
    - g. The competition commences at 9am on Wednesday, 1 September 2021 and closes at 5pm on Monday, 27 September 2021.
  3. How your entries will be judged:
    - a. This is a game of skill. Chance plays no part in determining the winner.
    - b. Each entry will be individually judged, based upon individual creative merit.
    - c. The panel reserve the right to disqualify any entrant submitting an entry which, in the opinion of the judges, includes objectionable content, including but not limited to profanity, nudity, potentially insulting, scandalous, inflammatory or defamatory images or language. The judges' decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
    - d. The voting will be done by a popular vote by the panel and the decision will be final.
    - e. Entrants must not seek to approach or influence any panel member during the judging period of this competition. No correspondence will be entered into between the panel and entrants except as set out in these Terms & Conditions.
  4. Winner announcement and prize:
    - a. Winners will be announced on Saturday, 9 October 2021 on World Migratory Shorebirds Day.
    - b. Winners will be notified by phone and email by a representative of the City of Canada Bay.
    - c. Winners will have to confirm that they can hand over their hardcopy artworks to Council by 12pm on Monday, 11 October 2021. If the prize winner fails to confirm this within this time period, the City of Canada Bay may award the prize to a runner up.
    - d. The original hardcopy of an artwork must be received by the City of Canada Bay within one week of notification. If the prize winner fails to confirm this within this time period, the City of Canada Bay may award the prize to a runner up.
    - e. Four winners will each receive a prize pack valued at \$150.
    - f. The prize is non-transferable and non-redeemable for cash.
    - g. The City of Canada Bay reserves the right to substitute any component of the prize for a prize of equal value at their discretion.
    - h. In the event that for any reason whatsoever a winner does not accept the prize, then the prize will be forfeited by the winner. Cash will not be awarded in lieu of the prize.
  5. Disclaimer, release and privacy:
    - a. All entries become and remain the property of the City of Canada Bay and agencies associated with this promotion (Canada Bay Council), and no entrant shall object or take any steps to prevent the use, development, alteration of the entry by Council.
    - b. By entering the competition, the entrant warrants they are the owner of all intellectual property rights in the artwork. Artwork that infringes intellectual property rights will be immediately removed from the competition. You agree to indemnify the City of Canada Bay against any costs that the City of Canada Bay may incur as a result of any intellectual property rights infringement.

The City of Canada Bay shall not be liable for any loss or damage whatsoever which is suffered (including, but not limited to, indirect or consequential loss) or for personal injury which is suffered or sustained, arising out of the redemption of the prize or in connection with the redemption of the prize, except for any liability which cannot be excluded by laws.
